**ORDER AUTHORIZING FURTHER
USE OF CASH COLLATERAL AND SETTING CONTINUED HEARING**
(Continued Hearing Set for May 5, 2026 at 1:30 PM)

This cause came before the Court for hearing on March 24, 2026, for a continued hearing on the Debtor-in-Possession, 4010 THOR COLLISION CORP (“Debtor”)’s Emergency Motion for Interim Use of Cash Collateral [ECF No. 11] (“Motion”), set by the Court’s March 2, 2026 *Order Granting Emergency Motion for Interim Use of Cash Collateral and Setting Further Hearing* [ECF No. 27]. The Court, having carefully considered the Motion and the court file, the budgets filed by counsel for the Debtor in advance of the hearing, having heard argument at the hearing, in an effort to avoid immediate and irreparable harm to Debtor, and otherwise being fully advised in the premises, it is

ORDERED that:

1. The Motion is **GRANTED**, and the further use of cash collateral as set forth herein is approved.

2. The Debtor is authorized to use only the cash collateral requested in the Motion and approved herein on an interim basis, as proposed in the proposed budget filed at ECF No. 45 (page 3) [March 25, 2026 through April 24, 2026], and for the additional period of April 25 through May 1, 2026, on an extended *pro rata* basis, as follows:

3. As requested in the Motion, the Debtor may further use up to 10% of cash collateral for such unforeseen costs that may arise from time to time, and that are required for ordinary maintenance and continued operation of the business.

4. On or before 12:00 noon on May 4, 2026, the Debtor shall file a budget vs. actual comparison, and proposed further budget with the Court.

5. The Court shall conduct a continued hearing on the Motion in this case on May 5, 2026, at 1:30 PM. The hearing will take place at the United States Bankruptcy Court located at 1515 N. Flagler Drive, Courtroom A, Room 801, West Palm Beach FL 33401.

6. Although the Court will conduct the hearing in person, any interested party may choose to attend the hearing remotely using the services of Zoom Video Communications, Inc. (“Zoom”), which permits remote participation by video or by telephone. To participate in the hearing remotely via Zoom (whether by video or by telephone), you must register in advance no later than 3:00 p.m., one business day before the date of the hearing.
