**SECOND INTERIM ORDER GRANTING DEBTOR'S  
MOTION FOR USE OF CASH COLLATERAL**

This case came before the Court on the Motion by All Star Medical, LLC, as Debtor and Debtor in Possession (“Debtor”), for Use of Cash Collateral pursuant to 11 U.S.C § 363 of Bankruptcy Code and Rule 4001(d) of the Federal Bankruptcy Rules (“Motion”). [Doc. 14]. Proper notice of the hearing was given and present at the hearing was Kevin D. Heard as counsel for the Debtor, Richard Blythe on behalf of the Bankruptcy Administrator’s Office and Chad Ayers, representing Progress Bank.

The record reflects that no objection to the Motion has been filed with the Court and none were made at the hearing. Based on representations of counsel for the Debtor at the hearing, the Court finds that the Debtor has met requirements under § 363 of the Bankruptcy Code for the use of cash collateral.

Accordingly, it is therefore ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the terms of this Court Order dated September 13, 2017 [Doc. 29] authorizing the Debtor to use cash collateral is extended to October 2, 2017. It is further ORDERED that the Debtor is hereby authorized to use Cash Collateral only to satisfy those actual expenses reasonable and necessary to the operation and maintenance of the Debtor’s business in accordance with the thirteen (13) week cash projection attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit “A” (hereinafter, the “Cash

Requirements Budget”).

A hearing on the Motion is re-scheduled for October 2, 2017 at 1:30 pm at the Federal Building, Cain Street Entrance, 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor Courtroom, Decatur AL 35601.
