("Debtor") in this case. In accordance with Section 333(b)(2) this 25 eighth interim report (the "Eighth Interim Report") is hereby respectfully submitted for the 26 period of February 1, 2017 through March 31, 2017. 27

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I. INTRODUCTION

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2	On December 18, 2015, the Court approved the appointment of a Patient Care		
3	Ombudsman in this case. On December 22, 2015, the Notice of Appointment of Constance R		
4	Doyle as Patient Care Ombudsman under 11 U.S.C. § section 333(b) (2) was filed. As set		
5	forth in the Order and the Appointment Notice, the Ombudsman was appointed to monitor the		
6	quality of patient care provided by the Debtor, to the extent necessary under the		
7	circumstances, including interviewing patients/clients, when appropriate, administration, staff		
8	physicians and other interested parties. Further to the Order and the Notice of Appointment, a		
9	review of confidential documents as provided by the Debtor, including patient/client records		
10	occurred. As per compliance with the Notice of Appointment, and the Order, no professionals		
11	or any other entities for assistance in the process were sought, accepting the assignment as a		
12	non-conflict of interest individual regarding the Debtors and other key individuals.		
13	Additionally, as per compliance with the Notice of Appointment, a one-page Notice was		
14	posted at the office of "Angels of the Valley Hospice, LLC" La Crescenta, CA., the place of		
15	business of the Debtor with contact information for the Ombudsman. Copy submitted with		
16	the 1 st Interim Report.		
17	Background information is reported as:		
18	Angels of the Valley Hospice, LLC (Debtor) began it service as a Hospice for the care		
10	of the terminally ill nations in 2004. As reported in the 1st I at 1 a		

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- 18 of the terminally ill patient in 2004. As reported in the 1st Interim Report, all employees are 19 on W2 payroll, insurance is current, as is license and the next survey by the accrediting body 20 is not due until December 2016. 21
- Service is rendered in patient's place of residence, hospital, etc., depending on the 22 23 circumstances.

II. SUMMARY OF PCO OBSERVATIONS AT THE ANGELS OF THE 25

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February 2017-March 2017

2	An increase in census was seen late January and into February, showing 18-21 and,		
3	there was 20 referrals in January from the IPO they hope to capture as a welcome referral		
4	base. There is a difference in the care and services between Home Health and Hospice, and		
5	understanding this is often hard for families to grasp. The PCO believes the staff at Angels of		
6	the Valley do a stellar job with their explanations and their caring attitude.		
7	In February, at the time of the visit, preparation for the upcoming Joint Commission		
8	Survey was ongoing. The anticipated arrival in January did not occur and there is hope it will		
9	finally happen by end of February.		
10	Mid-March shows a census of 18 with a few referrals on the horizon. No		
11	survey yet from the Joint Commission and continuous efforts ongoing to remain ready for		
12	their arrival. It was reported that an agreement with Apollo Med is in place and that the		
13	prediction is for an increase in referrals via them.		
14	III. <u>CONCLUSION</u>		
15	The Patient Care Ombudsman (PCO) finds that all care provided to the patients by		
16	Angels of the Valley Hospice, LLC remains well within the standard of care.		
17	The PCO will continue to monitor and is available to respond to any concerns or		
18	questions of the Court or interested party.
