DEBTOR'S APPLICATION FOR ENTRY OF AN ORDER FOR AUTHORIZING USE OF CASH COLLATERAL

Corsi Cab Corp., Anba Taxi, Inc., and Sincere Cab Corp., debtors and debtors and debtor-in-possession, ("Debtors"), as debtors and debtors in possession in the above-captioned chapter 11 case, respectfully represents:

- 1. The Debtors operate 3 related businesses at 544 Howard Avenue, 1A, Staten Island, NY 10301 that together own 7 taxi medallions. Taxi Medallion Loan Trust III ("Medallion"), holds the security interest in the medallions and the revenue generated by the medallions.
- 2. On December 18, 2018, the Debtors filed voluntary petitions for relief under chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code.
- 3. On January 28, 2019, this Court entered an order procedurally consolidating the cases filed by the Debtors and directing that they be jointly administered by the Court.
- 4. By this motion, the Debtor requests entry of an order authorizing it to use the net income from the medallions to pay the expenses of the Debtors. The medallions are managed by the Debtors who pay all the monthly expenses associated with operating the medallions and the Debtors' businesses. The income from the medallions is Medallion's cash collateral within the meaning of Section 363 of the Bankruptcy Code and the Debtors cannot use the income without permission of Medallion or an order of the Court. The Debtors need the income to operate and

pay their expenses, including insurance, car payments, vehicle maintenance, salaries, and chapter 11 quarterly fees. The Debtors will be depositing all the money that they received into the Debtor in Possession bank accounts. Annexed as Exhibit A, is a budget for the Debtors. If this Court approves the budget, the Debtors will pay all of the income, less the expenses set forth in the budget, each month to Medallion. The budget provides that Medallion will receive about one-thirds of the income.

5. A proposed order is annexed as Exhibit B.

WHEREFORE, for the reasons set forth herein, the Debtor respectfully requests that the the Debtor be authorized to use Medallion's cash collateral, together with such other relief as may be appropriate under the circumstances.
