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1. INTRODUCTION AND BANKRUPTCY PROVISIONS

1.1 BANKRUPTCY CODE PROVISIONS FOR POST PETITION DISCLOSURE:

Section 1125 of the Bankruptcy Code requires that a debtor makes postpetition disclosure in the form of a disclosure statement which provides "adequate information" to its creditors before debtor or a party acting on its behalf may solicit acceptances of a Chapter 11 plan of reorganization. Creditors are urged to consult with their attorney, or with each other, and to review all the pleadings and other documents on file with the U.S. Bankruptcy Court in order to fully understand the disclosures made herein, regarding Debtor's proposed Plan of Reorganization (hereafter referred to as the Plan) and any other pertinent matters in this case. A copy of the Plan prepared is attached to this Disclosure Statement.

1.2 DISCLAIMER:

Creditors are advised that the financial information contained in this Disclosure Statement has not been the object of an audit and is not certified by independent public accountants, except where expressly stated otherwise. Debtor does not warrant or represents that the information contained herein is without inaccuracy notwithstanding the efforts to disclose all matters with careful attention to accuracy and completeness.

1.3 VOTING REQUIREMENTS:

In order for the Plan to be confirmed by the Bankruptcy Court, the Bankruptcy Code requires that the Plan be approved by all impaired classes of creditors and interest holders or that the Court finds that the Plan is "fair and equitable" as to any dissenting class. As provided by 11 U.S.C. § 1124, a class of claims or interests is impaired under a plan unless, with respect to each claim or interest of such a class, the plan:

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- (1) leaves unaltered the legal, equitable, and contractual rights to which such claim or interest entitles the holder of such claim or interest; or
- (2) Notwithstanding any contractual provision or applicable law that entitles the holder of such claim or interest to demand or receive accelerated payment of such claim or interest after the occurrence of a default:
 - (A) Cures any such default that occurred before or after the commencement of the case under this title, other than a default of a kind specified in section 365(b)(2) of this title:
 - (B) reinstates the maturity of such claim or interest as such maturity existed before such default;
 - (C) Compensates the holder of such claim or interest for any damages incurred as a result of any reasonable reliance by such holder on such contractual provision or such applicable law;
 - (D) If such claim or such interest arises from any failure to perform a nonmonetary obligation, other than a default arising from failure to operate a nonresidential real property lease subject to section 365(b)(1)(A), compensates the holder of such claim or such interest (other than the debtor or an insider) for any actual pecuniary loss incurred by such holder as a result of such failure: and
 - (E) Does not otherwise; alter the legal, equitable, or contractual rights to which such claim or interest entitles the holder of such claim or interest.

Generally, but not in all circumstances, a plan may not be confirmed unless at least one impaired class, assuming there is at least one impaired class, accepts the plan. According to 11 U.S.C §1126(c), a class has accepted the plan if such plan has been accepted by creditors, other than any entity designated under subsection (e) of this section, that hold at least two-thirds (2/3) in amount and more than one-half (1/2) in number of the allowed claims of such class held by creditors, other than any entity designated under subsection (e) of this section, that have accepted or rejected such plan, that is, those actually voting for the Plan. Creditors may vote for the acceptance or rejection of the plan.

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Each creditor is urged to consult with its own attorney and obtain advice on the proposals and dispositions of this Disclosure Statement and Plan of Reorganization. The statements contained herein are only a summary of the confirmation process and should not be relied upon in making your determination as to whether to vote in favor of or against the Plan. Creditors should consult their attorneys before deciding to vote for or against the Plan.

Creditors are expressly referred to the Debtor's Schedules of Assets and Liabilities and the Statement of Financial Affairs and all other documents duly filed with the Bankruptcy Court. This Plan is predicated upon certain assumptions that may not materialize, and you are urged to consider such assumptions.

No representation concerning Debtor, or as to the actual or realizable value of its property is authorized by the Debtor other than as set forth in this Disclosure Statement. Any amendments or clarifications to this Disclosure Statement or the Plan shall be in writing and filed with the Court.

2. DEBTOR'S HISTORY AND EVENTS LEADING TO BANKRUPTCY

2.1 DEBTOR'S HISTORY

Debtor is a Not-for-Profit domestic corporation organized and existing under the laws of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico since February 24, 1960. It began as a For-Profit Private Hospital in the town of Guayama, Puerto Rico. In 1961, the Corporation acquired land to build the Hospital, of which the final blueprints were by the Planning Board in July 1963. On October 19, 1962, the Health Department announced that federal funding was available for the construction of Not-for-Profit Hospitals under a federal government accelerated program of public housing, and on that same day the application for such program was filed. The Hospital's Board of Directors called for an extraordinary meeting and a unanimous decision was reached. On October 23, 1962 the Incorporation Certificate was amended to convert this corporation into a Not-for-Profit entity.

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On July 27, 1963, Federal funding was approved, and in November of that same year, the Hospital began its construction. On December 6, 1965, Santa Rosa Hospital opened its doors to the first patients.

Santa Rosa Hospital is a general hospital with license issued by the Puerto Rico Health Department for 99 beds. It provides all basic services and has progressively added other specialties. Due to the distress economic conditions especially within the healthcare industry, by 2016 the Hospital was unable to sustain operations on its own and experienced constant deficits in its income that affected its ability to continue as a going concern. Thus, since that same year, Mennonite General Hospital, Inc. ("Mennonite") had been funding Santa Rosa Hospital's operations to cover the deficit helping the latter to continue providing services to the community until February 2017 when the Hospital close operations.

Reasons for Filing Bankruptcy

Since 2016, Debtor has suffered losses in its ordinary course of business. In order to continue to provide medical services to the community, Mennonite Hospital helped providing funds that guaranteed the going concern of this Notfor-Profit corporation until February 2017.

Debtor's operating losses precluded the payment of its two principal loans, with the U.S. Department of Agriculture (HUD) and Oriental Bank.

2.2 DATE THE PETITION WAS FILED:

The bankruptcy petition of Clinica Santa Rosa, Inc. was filed on November 14, 2016, under the provisions of Chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code. Since that date, debtors remain operating as Debtor in Possession until closing of the Hospital in February 2017.

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2.3 BANKRUPTCY PROCEEDINGS:

2.3.1 General

Upon filing of this bankruptcy petition, Debtor has taken all possible measures necessary to reorganize its respective business. Throughout these proceedings, Debtor has maintained compliance with the Bankruptcy Court's Operating Guidelines as follows:

- a) Monthly Operating Reports have been completed and filed with the Court up to April 30, 2018.
- b) Property and public liability insurance has been maintained for the commercial business and operations.
- c) Quarterly fees required by the U.S. Trustee are up to date.
- d) Tax returns and declarations have been filed as these become due.

2.3.2 Employment of Professionals:

On November 15, 2016, Clinica Santa Rosa Inc., filed an application to employ attorney Antonio I. Hernandez Santiago, as attorney for Debtor in Possession (Docket no. 5). Pursuant thereof, on December 20, 2016, the Court entered an Order approving this employment for the above captioned case (Docket no. 42).

On November 18, 2016, Debtor filed an application to employ Accountant Ms. Aida Escribano-Ramallo, of BDO Puerto Rico, P.S.C., which was approved by this Honorable Court on December 8, 2016. (Dockets No. 12 & 26). However, withdrew as Debtor's accountant on or about February 7, 2018. (Docket No. 245)

2.3.3 Operational Analysis Leading to a Liquidation Plan:

During the pendency of the bankruptcy case, Debtor together with his accountant have analyzed the operational reports and have attempted to identify business alternatives and managerial strategies that could maximize Debtor's business returns in its operations, as well as try to sell Debtor's assets

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in order for the Hospital Services to continue in the geographical area of Guayama, Puerto Rico. Debtor closed Hospital operations on February 28, 2017, but continues with the effort to sell the assets.

Accordingly, after careful evaluation, the Debtor purports that the organized liquidation of the appearing estate will be more beneficial to the creditors, and certainly, although moderate, will provide a dividend to them.

Mennonite has agreed to provide the necessary funds to fuel Debtor's Plan of Reorganization.

Pursuant to the aforementioned, Debtor's Plan of Reorganization proposed to move forward with the organized liquidation of this bankruptcy estate as it will result in a benefit to the creditors of the Estate.

2.3.4 Appointment of Creditor's Committee

As of the date hereof, the U.S. Trustee has not appointed a Creditors Committee for any of the above-captioned cases pursuant to section § 1102 of the Bankruptcy Code.

3. DEBTOR'S FINANCIAL INFORMATION

3.1 GENERAL FINANCIAL INFORMATION:

For purposes of filing the above-captioned petition, on November 14, 2016, (Docket no. 1). On December 13, 2016, Debtor filed the required Schedules A/B, D, E/F and H, Summary of Assets and Liabilities for Non-Individuals Schedules (Docket no. 32), and Statement of Financial Affairs for Non-Individuals (Docket no. 33).

The information provided in the Schedules filed and the Statements of Financial Affairs for Non-Individuals show Debtor's financial position as of the date of the filing of the petition. Business income and expenses are detailed in the accompanying income tax returns. Also, monthly operating reports available in the Bankruptcy Court file, show Debtor's finances and results of operations for the period after the date of the filing of the petition. A summary

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of all monthly operating reports has been prepared and enclosed herein as **Exhibit 1**.

Financial, accounting and, tax information included within this Disclosure Statement and the attached exhibits were provided in their entirety by the Debtor and/or Debtor's accountant.

3.2 ASSETS AND LIABILITIES AS OF PETITION DATE AS OF PETITION DATE

3.2.1 Schedules and Statement of Financial Affairs

As provided above, Debtor filed its respective Schedules, Summary of Assets and Liabilities for Non-Individuals and Statements of Financial Affairs for Non-Individuals with the Bankruptcy Court on December 13, 2016.

Among other things, the Schedules and Statements include the claims of known creditors against Debtor as of the Petition Date, based upon Debtor's books and records.

Moreover, a detail of Debtor's assets is provided in the liquidation analysis section, with updated values, as detailed herein in **Exhibit 2**.

3.2.2 Claims Bar date and Proof of Claims

On November 15, 2016, the Bankruptcy Court entered an Order setting the bar date for general unsecured claims until March 20, 2017 and for governmental units (as defined by section 101 (27) of the Bankruptcy Code) until May 15, 2017, (the "Bar Dates") (Docket no. 7).

Specifically, to date, Debtor has received 194 proofs of claim forms asserting approximately \$39,618,748.88 in claims. Debtor has begun the process of reviewing the asserted claims, as well as assessing the necessity to object those which are believe should be disallowed in whole or in part.

3.3 PENDING LITIGATION

There is no litigation pending, as of the date of the current Disclosure Statement.

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3.4 LIQUIDATION ANALYSIS:

One requirement for the confirmation of a plan under Chapter 11 of the U.S. Code is that, with respect to each impaired class of claims, each claim holder of such class has accepted the plan or will receive or retain under the plan on account of such allowed claim, a value as of the effective date of the plan, that is not less than the amount such claim holders would receive or retain if the Debtor was liquidated under Chapter 7 of the Code on such date. In order to provide the value as of the effective date of the plan under a Chapter 7 scenario, Debtor provides a detailed liquidation analysis.

For purposes of determining liquidation values for each case, Debtor has estimated and analyzed each scheduled asset and their estimated realizable values that could be obtained by a trustee under a Chapter 7 proceeding.

For the estimated realizable value, estimated administrative expenses have been reduced to determine the estimated amount for unsecured creditors in a liquidation process. Detailed liquidation analyses are enclosed as **Exhibit 2**.

The liquidation analysis prepared shows that, upon realization of estate assets and payment of liens and expenses, unsecured creditors would receive no dividend under a Chapter 7 proceeding inasmuch all realizable funds would be distributed to Secured claimants only. Furthermore, even Priority claimants won't receive any satisfaction of their claims under a Chapter 7 proceeding.

4. SUMMARY OF THE PLAN OF REORGANIZATION

4.1 DESIGNATION OF CLASSES OF CLAIMS AND INTERESTS IN DEBTOR'S CASE:

The Plan in Debtor's case divides creditors into SEVEN (7) classes. The classes of creditors are as follows:

CLASS 1 - ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSE

Administrative expenses are costs or expenses of administering Debtor's Chapter 11 case which are allowed under § 507(a)(2) and 503 of the

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Bankruptcy Code, including, but not limited to, the United States Trustee's quarterly fees; fees and expenses of Debtor and the creditor's committee counselors and other professionals as may be allowed by the Bankruptcy Court upon application therefore and after notice and hearing according to the Bankruptcy Code and Rules and; any unpaid taxes or fees accrued since petition date as well as court costs accrued since the petition date.

Administrative expenses also include the value of any goods sold to Debtor in the ordinary course of business and received within 20 days before the date of the bankruptcy petition. The Code requires that all administrative expenses be paid on the effective date of the Plan, unless a particular claimant agrees to a different treatment.

Debtor estimates the liability in this Class 1 not to be over the amount of \$653,109.00 and that it would be composed in all or in part of Post-Petition payables, United States Trustee's quarterly fees, payment of Debtor's counselor and, other professionals approved by the Court. It must be underscored that as part of the offer made by Mennonite, the post-petition amount owed by Debtor to Mennonite will receive no dividend.

CLASS 2 - SECURED CLAIM - USDA RURAL DEVELOPMENT ("RURAL")

This class is comprised of USDA Rural Development (hereafter "Rural"). This creditor filed POC NO. 191, within which classified the amount of \$13,861,820.08, as a secured claim. Upon confirmation of the Plan of Reorganization, the Debtor shall transfer to Mennonite Real Property and Equipment over which creditor Rural holds a secured interest, meaning Santa Rosa I and Santa Rosa II, and all Equipment in which Rural Development has a lien.

CLASS 3 – SECURED CLAIM – U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT ("HUD")

The amount claimed within this Class relate to certain commercial loan granted to Debtor by U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development

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(hereafter "HUD"). This creditor classifies its secured interest within POC No.

192 in the amount of \$1,027,868.84.

This creditor retains and holds a secured interest which encumbers the lot of

land in which Hogar Santa Rosa Inc. built its facilities.

CLASS 4 - SECURED CLAIM - HOSPITAL MENONITA GUAYAMA.INC.

(PREVIOUSLY ORIENTAL BANK)

The amount claimed relates to certain commercial loan granted to Debtor by

Oriental Bank. This creditor classifies its secured interest within POC No. 54

for the total amount of \$2,164,336.00, of which \$1,059,354.00 were filed as

Secured amount. Said claim was transferred to Hospital Menonita

Guayama.Inc. on or about December 20,2017.

CLASS 5 - SECURED CLAIM - SALI COOP.

This Class is comprised of certain amounts included within POCs No. 13, 14

and 15 filed by Sali Coop., with a secured interest in the amounts of

\$14,383.55; \$15,962.68; and \$14,433.55, respectively, which relates to several

of the properties of the bankruptcy estate.

CLASS 6 - SECURED CLAIM - MERCEDES-BENZ

This class is comprised of certain amount included within POC No. 26, filed on

behalf of Mercedes-Benz, with a secured interest in the amount of \$52,070.45;

and a repeated claim POC No. 165 for the same total amount, but with

\$29,625.00 as secured and \$52,219.69, which relates to a vehicle, property of

the bankruptcy estate.

CLASS 7 - GENERAL UNSECURED CREDITORS

General unsecured creditors considering those listed by the Debtor, those who

filed a proof of claim and those secured creditors, who after Debtor's efforts

have agreed so that part of their claim be considered as unsecured, are

included in this class. This class may also account and include any unsecured

balance due that may result upon the liquidation or turnover of any collateral.

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Pursuant thereof, Debtor estimates this class in the amount of \$24,025,922.

4.2 TREATMENT FOR CLASSES OF CLAIMS AND INTEREST

CLASS 1 – ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES

This Class shall consist of Allowed Administrative Expense Claims, as provided under Section 503 of the Bankruptcy Code. This class shall be paid in full as soon as practicable or agreed with the creditor on the later of (a) the Effective Date or (b) the date any such claim becomes an allowed Administrative Claim. Allowed claimants under this class approximate \$ 653,109.00 since the same has been reduced to eliminate the post-petition amounts owed to Mennonite. This class is not impaired.

CLASS 2 - SECURED CLAIM - U.S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE RURAL DEVELOPMENT ("RURAL")

This class is comprised of USDA Rural Development (hereafter "Rural"). This creditor filed POC NO. 191, within which this creditor classifies the amount of \$13,861,820.08, as a secured claim. Upon confirmation of the Plan of Reorganization, the Debtor shall transfer to Mennonite General Hospital, Inc., real property and equipment over which creditor Rural holds a secured interest, meaning Santa Rosa I and Santa Rosa II, and all Equipment in which Rural Development has a lien. Rural will be paid the total amount of \$2,400,000.00. Upon the execution of the transfer of the properties to Mennonite, all properties will be transferred free and clear of liens, pursuant to 11 U.S.C. §1123(a) and 11 U.S.C. § 1141(c). The transfer of the realty property pursuant to the Confirmed Plan of Reorganization will have the benefits of the exemption provided for by 11 U.S.C. §1146(a) and the same will not be subject to any stamp tax, real estate transfer tax or similar tax. Any deficiency resulting upon deducting the transfer value from the total amount claim in POC 191 will be considered a general unsecured claim within Class 7. This class is impaired.

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CLASS 3 - SECURED CLAIM - U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT ("HUD")

Creditor U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (hereafter "HUD") filed POC No. 192, for the amount of \$ 1,027,868.84, classified as Secured portions. Regarding the treatment to be provided, Debtor will transfer all rights and obligations of the real property of Hogar Santa Rosa, Inc., to Mennonite who will conclude all necessary proceedings and documents to conclude the transfer purchase agreement to Hogar Santa Rosa, Inc. This class is impaired.

CLASS 4 - SECURED CREDITOR - HOSPITAL MENONITA GUAYAMA, INC. (PREVIOUSLY ORIENTAL BANK)

This Class consists of Creditor Hospital Menonita Guayama, Inc., which filed POC No. 54, for the total amount of \$ 2,164,336.00, of which \$ 1,059,354.00 were filed as Secured amount. The secured claim comprises as collateral Equipment and Pre-petition accounts receivable (Cash Collateral). Regarding treatment for this debt, Debtor surrenders all collateral to Hospital Menonita Guayama, Inc. in full payment of the secured portion of its claim. The unsecured portion of POC NO. 54 will be considered a general unsecured claim within Class 7.

This class is impaired.

CLASS 5 - SECURED CLAIMS - SALI COOP.

Creditor Sali Coop., filed POC No. 13, for the amount of \$ 14,383.55; POC No. 14, for the amount of \$ 15,962.68; and POC No. 15, for the amount of \$ 14,433.55, consisting of three (3) of Auto Loans in which Creditor Sali Coop., has a dully registered conditional sale contract. Debtor will surrender collateral to Creditor, Sali Coop., in full payment of the amount owed.

This class is impaired.

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CLASS 6 - SECURED CLAIM - MERCEDES-BENZ

Secured creditor Mercedes-Benz filed POC No. 26, for the amount of

\$52,070.45, and a repeated claim POC No. 165 for the same total amount, but

with \$29,625.00 as secured and \$52,219.69 as unsecured. This class consists

of a conditional sale contract with Mercedes-Benz. This claim is subject to a

stipulation for Lift of Stay with this creditor. Debtor surrenders the collateral to

this Creditor. The unsecured portion of POC NO. 165, will be considered a

general unsecured claim within class 7.

This class is impaired.

CLASS 7 - GENERAL UNSECURED CREDITORS

This Class will receive a lump sum payment of a total amount of \$20,000.00,

on the effective date of the Plan. Each member of this class holding an allowed

claim will begin receiving a prorated dividend of the proposed distribution, as

per the Schedule Payments under the Plan of Reorganization enclosed herein

as **Exhibit 3.**

This class is impaired.

4.3 PAYMENT OF UNSECURED PRIORITY GOVERNMENT CLAIMS UNDER

11 U.S.C. SECTION 507(a)(8) and. §507(a)(3):

Allowed secured government claims pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 506 and

unsecured priority claims pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 507(a)(8) of the Code, and as

the same are allowed, approved and ordered to be paid by the Court, will be

paid as stated in Exhibit 3

Debtor estimates allowed priority claims in the amount of \$636,727.00 which

are further detailed in Exhibit 3

Accordingly, this class will not receive monthly cash dividend pursuant

Debtor's Plan. Upon de confirmation hearing, these creditors will receive a

dividend equal to all funds available to de Debtor after the payment of all

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administrative expenses for which the plan proposes a payment, and the carve out of \$20,000.00 proposed to general unsecured creditors. The dividend to be received by these priority creditors has been estimated in the amount of \$636,727.00. See Schedule Payments under the Plan of Reorganization, **Exhibit 3**.

This class is impaired, and will be required to vote for Debtor's Plan.

4.4 IMPAIRMENT OF EXISTING CLAIMS AND INTERESTS:

As provided by 11 U.S.C. 1124, a class of claims or interests is impaired under a plan unless, with respect to each claim or interest of such a class, the plan:

- (1) leaves unaltered the legal, equitable, and contractual rights to which such claim or interest entitles the holder of such claim or interest; or
- (2) Notwithstanding any contractual provision or applicable law that entitles the holder of such claim or interest to demand or receive accelerated payment of such claim or interest after the occurrence of a default.
 - a. cures any such default that occurred before or after the commencement of the case under this title, other than a default of a kind specified in section 365(b)(2) of this title;
 - b. reinstates the maturity of such claim or interest as such maturity existed before such default;
 - c. compensates the holder of such claim or interest for any damages incurred as a result of any reasonable reliance by such holder on such contractual provision or such applicable law; and
 - d. does not otherwise alter the legal, equitable, or contractual rights to which such claim or interest entitles the holder of such claim or interest.

4.5 DISCHARGE OF CLAIMS:

Except as otherwise provided for in this Plan or in the Order of Confirmation, the rights granted by the Plan and the payments and distributions to be made there under, shall be in complete exchange for, and in full satisfaction, and release of, all existing debts and claims of any kind, nature or description

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whatsoever against the Debtor. On the Consummation Date, all existing claims shall be deemed to be exchanged, satisfied, and released in full; and all holders of claims shall be precluded from asserting any other or future claim based upon any act or omission, transaction or other activity of any kind or nature that occurred prior to the Consummation Date, whether or not such holder filed a proof of claim.

In accordance with § 1141(d)(3) of the Code, the Debtor will not receive any discharge of debt in this bankruptcy case.

The confirmation order of this Plan shall constitute an injunction against the pursuit of any claim or Equity Interest, whether or not a proof of claim or proof of interest based on any such debt, liability, or interest, is filed or deemed filed under 11 U.S.C. 501, such claim is allowed under 11 U.S.C. 502, or the holder of such claim has accepted this Plan in the manner set forth herein.

4.6 OBJECTIONS TO CLAIMS:

The Debtor, at its option or upon order of the Bankruptcy Court, if requested may file an objection to any claim as to its validity or amount within 30 days before the confirmation date and may substitute for the Debtor as the objecting party to any pending claim objections. Objections not filed by the date of confirmation shall be deemed waived. If an objection is made, payment to such Claimants will be made only after the entry of a final order by the Court allowing such claim and in accordance with the provisions of the Plan governing such class to which such claim belongs.

The claim of any creditor whose claim has been scheduled as disputed but who has not filed a proof of claim shall be disallowed by confirmation of the Plan, unless written objection to such disallowance is filed prior to the confirmation hearing.

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5. OTHER PROVISIONS

5.1 EXECUTORY CONTRACTS:

Debtor rejects all unexpired leases and executory contracts to which it is a party, and which have not been expressly assumed pursuant to 11 U.S.C. Section 365(a).

5.2 MEANS OF EXECUTION OF THE PLAN AND FUTURE MANAGEMENT OF DEBTOR:

Debtor shall have sufficient funds to make all payments due under this Plan because Mennonite will provide said funds in order to obtain all rights over Debtor's assets. The Plan will be implemented as required under §1123(a) (5) of the Code.

Other main and only distribution contemplated within the Plan, are to be made through the sale of the hospital facilities and/or transfer of properties, for the total amount of \$3,709,836,consisting of \$653,109.00 to pay administrative claims,\$2,400,000.00 to pay Rural's secured claim,\$636,727 to pay priority claims, and \$20,000.00 carve-out to pay unsecured claims. All necessary expenses of these transfers shall be covered by the acquiring party.

After the transfer of the properties contemplated in the Plan and the confirmation of the Plan, Debtor will have no assets and no liabilities and will proceed to close the corporation in the Puerto Rico Department of State.

5.3 PROVISIONS FOR THE MODIFICATION OF THE PLAN:

The Debtor may propose amendments or modifications of this Plan at any time prior to its confirmation pursuant to 11 U.S.C. 1127. After confirmation of the Plan, the Reorganized Debtor may, with the approval of the Court and as long as it does not adversely affect the interests of the creditors, remedy any defect or omission, in such manner as may be necessary to carry out the purposes and effects of the same.

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5.4 CLOSING OF THE CASE:

At such time as the case has been substantially consummated, this case shall

be closed. In order for the case to be close, Debtor shall file an application for

final decree showing that the case has been fully administered and the Plan

has been substantially consummated. The Court may conduct a hearing upon

application thereof and after notice to all creditors and parties in interests.

Thereafter an order approving the Debtor's report and closing of the case shall

be entered.

5.5 RETENTION OF JURISDICTION:

The Bankruptcy Court shall retain jurisdiction over this case as is conferred

upon it by law, rule or statute, or by this Plan, to enable the Debtor to

consummate any and all proceedings which they may bring before or after the

entry of the order of confirmation, in order to carry out the provisions of this

Plan.

This is the Disclosure Statement and Plan of Reorganization hereby proposed

to creditors and parties in interest, filed with the Honorable Bankruptcy Court

on this same date. Parties are encouraged to review these documents in order

to formulate an informed decision on Debtor's whereabouts and conditions. A

hearing to consider the approval of this Disclosure Statement will be scheduled

by the Honorable Court, with Notice of said hearing served to all parties as per

the master address list.

ASSUMPTIONS AND BASIS FOR PREPARATION OF THE LIQUIDATION ANALYSIS

One requirement for the confirmation of a plan under Chapter 11 of the U.S. Code is that with respect to each impaired class of claims, each claim holder of such class has accepted the plan or will receive or retain under the plan on account of such allowed claim, a value as of the effective date of the plan, that is not less than the amount such claim holder would receive or retain if the debtor is liquidated under Chapter 7 of the Code. In order to provide the value as of the effective date of the plan under a Chapter 7 scenario, debtor provides a detailed liquidation analysis.

The first step in determining whether the liquidation component of this test has been satisfied is to determine the dollar amount that would be generated from the liquidation of a debtor's assets and properties in the context of a Chapter 7 liquidation case. The gross amount of cash that would be available for satisfaction of claims would be the sum consisting of the proceeds resulting from the disposition of the unencumbered assets and properties of the debtor and any preference recoveries augmented by the unencumbered cash held by the debtor at the time of the commencement of the liquidation case.

The next step is to reduce the gross amount by the costs and expenses of liquidation and by such additional administrative and priority claims that might result from the termination of the debtor's business and the use of a Chapter 7 for the purposes of liquidation. Any remaining net cash would be allocated to creditors in strict priority in accordance with section 726 of the U.S. Bankruptcy Code. Finally, the value of such allocations (not taking into account the time necessary to accomplish the liquidation) is compared to the value of the property that is proposed to be distributed under the Plan on the Effective Date.

A debtor's costs of liquidation under a Chapter 7 would include the fees payable to a bankruptcy trustee, as well as those fees that might be payable to attorneys and other professionals which such a trustee might engage. Other liquidation costs include the expenses incurred during the Chapter 11 cases allowed in a Chapter 7 case, such as compensation for attorneys, financial advisors, appraisers, accountants, and other professionals for the debtor appointed in the Chapter 11 cases, as well as other compensation claims.

NOTES TO LIQUIDATION ANALYSIS

In the best interest of creditors and given the current financial information to this date, Debtor presents its liquidation analysis. In this analysis debtor incorporate the estimated result of possible outcome and effect of negotiations with secured creditors, as this Clinica Santa Rosa, Inc. Case no. 16-09033 (EAG) EXHIBIT 2

related to the plan of reorganization, and final outcome should be available in preparation for the hearing on confirmation to be scheduled in this case.

Real Properties:

Debtor owns lots of real properties as listed in the Schedules in the items 55.1 thru 55.9 and located in Guayama, Puerto Rico. These real properties, as listed in the schedules, have mortgages secured creditors: USDA Rural Development and US Department of Housing and Urban Development. In these lots are constructed the facilities of a general hospital composed of main hospital building, parking, pharmacy, warehouse, radiology and hospital related departments. These lots had been presented at the scheduled value at the petition date.

The fee simple market or schedule value for all real property totaled, including the estimated liquidation value are \$4,724,000.

Personal Properties:

A. Cash on Bank Accounts

For the purpose of determining a liquidation value on the cash on bank, debtor considered as realizable in a chapter 7 scenario 100% of the amounts presented as filed detailed in the schedules.

B. Accounts Receivables, Inventory and Machinery and Equipment

For the purpose of determining a liquidation value on the account receivables and inventory, debtor considered as realizable in a chapter 7 scenario 50% of the amounts presented as filed detailed in the schedules. For the machinery and equipment, debtor considered as realizable in a chapter 7 scenario 75% of the amounts as filed detailed in the schedules. These items are encumbered by secured creditor Hospital Menonita Guayama, Inc. (previously Oriental Bank).

C. Vehicles

For the purpose of determining a liquidation value in the vehicles, schedules items 47.1 thru 47.11; debtor considered as realizable in a chapter 7 scenario 75% of the amounts presented as filed detailed in the schedules. Some vehicles as listed in the exhibit has financing liens.

D. Equipment - Under Construction

For the purpose of determining a liquidation value in the equipment – under construction, debtor considered as realizable in a chapter 7 scenario 75% of the amounts presented as

filed detailed in the schedules. This equipment is fully encumbered by USDA Rural Development.

Administrative Claims:

Administrative Claims are claims constituting the costs and expenses of administering the Debtor's Chapter 11 cases, as provided by sections 503(b), 507(b), and 1114(e)(2) of the U.S. Bankruptcy Code. Administrative Claims generally include the actual and necessary costs and expenses incurred after the applicable Commencement Date of preserving the Debtor's estates and operating the business of the Debtor. Administrative Claims also consist of the fees and expenses of various legal, financial, and other professionals incurred during the Chapter 11 cases, and also all the fees due to the United States Trustee pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1930(a)(6) and allowed reimbursable expenses of the members of the Committee.

Under a Chapter 7 scenario, the Trustee would need to incur in expenses during the liquidation process and would also charge his own fees as allowed by the U.S. Bankruptcy Code. These payments would be paid from the Estate's funds and prior to all Chapter 11 administrative claims, priority claims and general unsecured claims.

Administrative Expenses under a Chapter 7 scenario:

Based on the estimated disbursement in liquidation would be around \$319,812, the stamps, notarial, realtor and trustee's fees are estimated on overall average of 20% which approximate to a total fees within this category of expenses of \$63,962.

Administrative Expenses under a Chapter 11 scenario:

<u>Legal and Accounting Fees:</u> These fees are the estimated amount that the Debtor has to pay for legal and accounting work to complete the Chapter 11 Case upon confirmation.

<u>U.S. Trustee Quarterly Fees:</u> Amount estimated to be paid to the United States Trustee, for the next three months of operation upon confirmation.

The Liquidation Analysis prepared for this case shows that the estimated dividend for the general unsecured creditors under a Chapter 7 is 0%. The proposed Plan of Reorganization provides a lump sum payment, distributed on a pro-rata basis within the allowed amount by plan in this class, of \$20,000 to general unsecured creditors listed in Class 7 at the Effective Date of Plan.

MEANS OF EXECUTION OF THE PLAN

The accompanying schedule is an integral part of Debtor's Disclosure Statement and Plan of Reorganization. The following is a brief description of the Designation of Classes of Claims and treatment of each one under the plan.

I. The plan divides the creditors in 7 classes, including administrative, plus the priority claimants as follows:

CLASS 1 – ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES

This Class shall consist of Allowed Administrative Expense Claims, as provided under Section 503 of the Bankruptcy Code. Rural will be paid the total amount of \$2,400,000.00. Upon the execution of the transfer of the properties to Mennonite, all properties will be transferred free and clear of liens, pursuant to 11 U.S.C. §1123(a) and 11 U.S.C. § 1141(c). The transfer of the realty property pursuant to the Confirmed Plan of Reorganization will have the benefits of the exemption provided for by 11 U.S.C. §1146(a) and the same will not be subject to any stamp tax, real estate transfer tax or similar tax. Any deficiency resulting upon deducting the transfer value from the total amount claim in POC 191 will be considered a general unsecured claim within Class 7.

This class is impaired.

CLASS 3 -- SECURED CLAIM - U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT ("HUD")

Regarding the treatment to be provided, Debtor will transfer all rights and obligations of the real property of Hogar Santa Rosa, Inc., to Mennonite who will conclude all necessary proceedings and documents to conclude the transfer purchase agreement to Hogar Santa Rosa, Inc.

This class is impaired.

Debtor estimates allowed priority claims in the amount of \$636,727.00 which are further detailed in **Exhibit 3.**

Accordingly, this class will not receive monthly cash dividend pursuant Debtor's Plan. Upon de confirmation hearing, these creditors will receive a dividend equal to all funds available to de Debtor after the payment of all administrative expenses for which the plan proposes a payment, and the carve out of \$20,000.00 proposed to general unsecured creditors. The dividend to be received by these priority creditors has been estimated in the amount of \$636,727.00. See Schedule Payments under the Plan of Reorganization, Exhibit 3.

This class is impaired, and will be required to vote for Debtor's Plan.

II. Means of Execution of the plan

Debtor shall have sufficient funds to make all payments due under this Plan because Hospital General Menonita, Inc. will provide said funds in order to obtain all rights over Debtor's assets. The Plan will be implemented as required under §1123(a) (5) of the Code.
