### MOTION FOR ORDER APPROVING CONTINUED USE OF CASH COLLATERAL

241 Main Street, Inc. ("Debtor-In-Possession" or "Debtor") hereby moves this Court for entry of an order, pursuant to 11 U.S.C. §§ 363 authorizing Debtor's continued use of cash collateral of RBS Citizens, N.A. ("Citizens"), Vend Lease Company (Vend Lease); Rewards Network Establishment Services, Inc., ("Rewards Network"); Sysco Boston, LLC ("Sysco"); and NextWave Enterprises, LLC ("NextWave") or (the "Secured Creditors") for an additional thirty (30) days, from October 26, 2017 through November 25, 2017, and to provide adequate protection to Citizens for the Debtor's use of cash collateral and grant replacement liens to Citizens to the extent and priority as more fully set forth in the Final Order (Doc No. 29). This motion is filed because of the Debtor's need to continue to use cash collateral to continue the operation of its business and maintain its workforce. Attached hereto is the Debtor's most recent budget – to – actual report dated October 6, 2017.

In support of this Motion, the Debtor states the following:

The Court entered a Final Order on September 5, 2017 (Doc No. 29) authorizing use of the Citizens' cash collateral. The Order authorized the Debtor's use of cash collateral through October 5, 2017, with certain monthly adequate protection payments to Citizens. In addition the Court entered an Order on October 10, 2017 (Doc No. 57) authorizing the continued use of cash collateral through October 25, 2017, with certain monthly adequate protection payments to Citizens. Without continued use of cash collateral after October 25, 2017, with certain monthly adequate

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2017, Debtor will be unable to fund continued operations and will have to close. 241 Main Street, Inc. desires to continue to operate and continue its negotiation to propose a plan.

WHEREFORE, the Debtor requests entry of an order allowing the continued use of the Citizens' cash collateral through November 25, 2017 in order to continue operations while it proceeds to negotiate a plan.
