
We refer to your letter dated 7 July 2005 and our letters to you dated 13 June 2005 and 23 June 2005.

You have brought to our attention the contents of a letter dated 30 June 2005 from a Mr Max Huang to the Accounting and Corporate Regulatory Authority (ACRA) whereby he stated that he is the beneficial owner of 80 per cent of the 70 per cent shareholding of Greatronic Technology (M) Sdn Bhd registered in the name of Mr Lim Kok Koon. Mr Huang had also stated in his letter to ACRA that the transactions between Greatronic Technology (M) Sdn Bhd, a Malaysian registered entity, and Greatlink International Inc in the United States of America and Greatlink Electronics Germany GmbH are all fictitious transactions.

The dispute on the ownership of 70 per cent of the shareholding in Greatronic Technology (M) Sdn Bhd registered in Mr Lim's name is a civil matter for which CAD would not be investigating. As for Mr Huang's claim that the transactions between Greatronic Technology (M) Sdn Bhd and its associates in the United States and Germany are fictitious, a complaint should be lodged with the Malaysian authorities as the falsifications, if true, were committed in Malaysia. There is no evidence that any part of those transactions were carried out in Singapore. CAD has no jurisdiction to investigate into any alleged falsification committed overseas.

Unless, it is proven that the transactions between the Malaysian company and the United States and German companies are false, the results of the Malaysian company incorporated into the group results of Greatronic Limited cannot be ascertained to be false. Accordingly, CAD is not in a position to investigate into your complaint.
